Chair Renehan began the discussion, with the question on whether there should be hours of operation put in place for adult businesses. Each Member of the Committee spoke and shared their thoughts. There was some discussion between members, as well as questions asked of Assistant State's Attorney on clarification of some points of the ordinance. ASA Anthony Hayman, explained some of the options that could be considered in adding hours of operation to the ordinance. More discussion ensued about the definition of an adult business per the Zoning Text Amendment passed earlier this year. Member Elliott withdrew his previous motion and replaced it with a motion to amend the draft ordinance in a suitable form by the State's Attorney's Office to have the effect of restricting live entertainment and video booths between the hours of 2 AM to 6 AM.

Chair Renehan requested a motion to add an amendment, to incorporate the Human Trafficking Resource Center Notice Act (775 ILCS 50/5 and 775 ILCS 50/10) to be posted in the establishments in accordance with state law. All members were in agreement in adding this amendment.

Vice Chair DeSart provided the Committee and ASO with modifications to the ordinance to clarify various aspects of the regulations.

ASA McCarthy said he would present a clean copy of the document at the next meeting. Chair Renehan asked for a Special Call Meeting for next week, on Tuesday, June 18th.
