

APPLYING FOR SERVICES

This directory contains the names, addresses, websites, and telephone numbers (Toll-Free whenever possible) of organizations that offer assistance to older adults and their families. A brief description of each organization outlines the services they provide. If you are not sure who to contact for specific information or a particular service, please call **DuPage County Senior Services, (630) 407-6500**, or toll-free at **1-800-942-9412**. They will help identify your need, arrange services if possible, or refer you to an agency that can provide the appropriate assistance. The following questions may help us determine the services available, explain eligibility guidelines and discuss costs involved, if any.

1. What services or resources are needed?
2. What are the eligibility requirements for these programs?
3. Are there any fees?
4. How to apply, by phone, mail, e-mail, or in person?
5. If homebound, can someone make a home visit to explain services or assist with the application process?
6. What documents are needed to apply for the service(s)?
7. What is the process and when will I be notified of my eligibility?
8. When will service(s) begin?

If you have an application that's difficult to complete, call the provider agency. If they are unable to provide the help you need, **DuPage County Senior Services** will help guide you through the application process.

Some applicants may be denied service due to program guidelines. An inquiry to the agency denying the service may provide an explanation of your ineligibility, explain appeal procedures, offer guidance on future eligibility or refer you to other helpful services. If you feel you have been wrongly denied for a government service or benefit, please call **DuPage County Senior Services** to explore your recourse.
