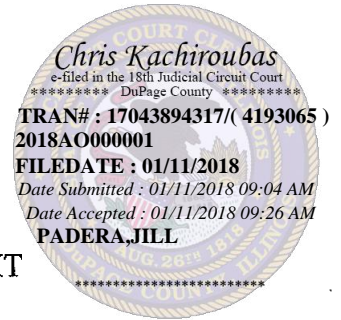

WHEREAS, the 18th Judicial Circuit's Department of Probation and Court Services has been requested to provide local juvenile justice system data to the Illinois Juvenile Justice Commission (IJJC); and

WHEREAS, IJJC has contracted with the Illinois Collaboration On Youth (ICOY) to collect and report this statewide data to the federal Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP); and

WHEREAS, this comprehensive report is required for Illinois to stay in compliance with federal mandates and maintain juvenile justice funding; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Probation and Court Services of the 18th Judicial Circuit has successfully worked with ICOY, IJJC and OJJDP, procuring grants to currently administer programs; and

WHEREAS, our current grant with IJJC requires the Department to produce a local data scan and make that data scan available to the IJJC; and

WHEREAS, the Research Division of the IJJC complies with the Common Rule regarding human research and possesses a Federal-wide Assurance with the Office of Human Research Protections; and

WHEREAS, all data will be collected without personally identifying information; and


WHEREAS, the data that is provided by the Department of Probation and Court Services of the 18th Judicial Circuit will be aggregated with data from all other counties included in the study, and specific counties will not be identifiable to other counties; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Probation and Probation Officers Act (730 ILCS 110/12(4)) protects the confidentiality of probation records from public disclosure except by order of the court.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that the Illinois Juvenile Justice Commission be granted access to Probation's caseload data as it pertains to race, ethnicity, and gender, at nine critical decision points, ranging from arrest to admission to the Department of Juvenile Justice.
