



## *Addendum to Administrative Order 19-20*

Poverty: The state of one who lacks a usual or socially acceptable amount of money or material possessions.

Indigence: A level of poverty in which real hardship and deprivation are suffered and comforts of life are wholly lacking.

### **GUIDELINES FOR DETERMINING POVERTY**

#### **Maximum Income Schedules – 125%**

<b><u>Family Size</u></b>	<b><u>Weekly</u></b>	<b><u>Monthly</u></b>	<b><u>Annually</u></b>
1	\$300	\$1,301	\$15,613
2	407	1,762	21,138
3	513	2,222	26,663

(Additional person – add \$5,525/year)

Special circumstances: If other eligibility criteria are met, indigency may be granted if the applicant's gross income does not exceed 200% of the national poverty level.
