Dear Joy,

The level of contamination contained in residentially collected post-consumer recyclable materials in DuPage County (and suburbs of neighboring counties) has been significantly increasing over time with the advent of automated single stream recycling collection, where more and more non-designated materials are being placed into lidded recycling carts and containers. The attached list of 'acceptable' and 'unacceptable' materials illustrates examples.

The average increase in contamination of DuPage and neighboring suburban residential single stream recycling programs that we have been receiving over the past 16 years is summarized as follows:

<u>Year</u>	<u>% Contamination</u>
2001	7.50%
2007	9.56%
2009	12.15%
2014	15.97%
2015	20.07%
2016	20.82%
2017	21.84%

The following suggestions are offered to materially reduce contamination associated with residential single stream recyclable materials:

- Have municipalities invest in updated education to residents regarding what 'is' and 'is not' to be included in recycling carts, including recognition about citizens responsibility to prevent the growing problem of contamination and to recognize the additional costs associated with contamination (higher collection costs, higher processing costs, lower net material value, and negative environmental impact associated with collecting and handling contamination that should have been put into the trash bin in the first place).
- Get current 'buy-in' and support from municipal officials and staff to recognize that residential recycling collection bids are based on the contracted list of designated recyclable materials (and nothing else) and that contamination results in added collection and processing costs that in the long term results in higher residential recycling collection costs.
- Consider opportunities to utilize 'tag & leave behind' collection programs where contaminated recycling carts are first 'tagged' to inform the generator what the specific

contamination is, and to 'leave behind' a recycling cart if the generator continues to cause contamination in spite of repeated warnings. Municipalities need to fully support and work with their recycling collection contractor when 'tag & leave behind' collection programs are implemented.

- Consider opportunities to inspect materials tipped from recycling routes at transfer stations to identify routes having contamination, and determine actual sources of contamination, with subsequent follow-up by drivers to inspect recycling containers at pickup points and communicate problems to customer service staff who would follow-up and work with specific generators causing contamination.

We hope this information is useful in formulating DuPage County's Solid Waste Management Plan Five Year Update to optimize recycling.

**RESIDENTIAL & COMMERCIAL SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING
RECYCLABLE MATERIALS ACCEPTED BY RESOURCE MANAGEMENT**

Never put recyclables into a plastic bag!

Toss only the following designated recyclables loose into the recycling cart!

Do not put any other materials into the recycling cart!

Keep recycling cart lids closed to keep recyclable materials dry!

DESIGNATED CONTAINERS:

Empty and rinse all containers. Reattach lids and caps back onto plastic containers.

Aluminum Cans, Trays & Foil (*trays & foil must be cleaned*)

Steel Cans & Tins & Metal Caps from glass bottles & jars

Aseptic Packaging & Gable Top Containers (such as milk & juice cartons)

Glass Bottles and Jars - (clear, brown, green) *remove metal caps*

No window glass, auto glass, dinnerware or ceramics.

PET Bottles (#1 clear and green plastic resin);

such as Soda, Water & Flavored Beverage Containers.

HDPE Translucent Containers (#2 clear plastic resin);

such as Milk, Water & Juice Jugs.

HDPE Color Containers (#2 colored plastic resin);

such as Detergent & Fabric Softener Containers.

PVC Narrow Neck Containers Only (#3 plastic resin);

such as health & beauty aid products, household cleaners.

LDPE Food Containers (#4 plastic resin);

such as margarine tubs, frozen desert cups.

PP Food Containers (#5 plastic resin);

such as yogurt cups, cottage cheese/cream cheese containers, narrow neck syrup, cooking oil, ketchup bottles.

#7 Plastic Resin Narrow Neck Containers Only.

Plastic Buckets, such as kitty litter containers (*5 gal maximum - no metal handles*)

NOTE: No #6 plastic (no foam cups/trays/packaging/etc.)

DESIGNATED PAPER FIBER: *Do not put wet paper into the recycling cart!*

Newspaper, including inserts (*remove plastic sleeves*)

Cardboard (*no waxed cardboard*)

Kraft (brown paper) Bags

Magazines, Catalogs and Telephone Books

Office, Computer, Notebook & Gift Wrap Paper (*no metal clips, spirals, binders*)

Chipboard (cereal, cake & food mix boxes, gift boxes, shoe boxes, etc.)

Carrier Stock (soda & beer can carrying cases)

Junk Mail & Envelopes (*no plastic cards, stick on labels or unused stamps*)

Paper Back Books (*no hard cover books*)

NOTE: No shredded paper!

Joy,

I appreciate you forwarding this to me for comment. I have a few and hope they can add value.

1.) Definition of Food Scrap. As I understand this is the current definition in the Act, I think we would be remiss to put this out in a plan update including the packaging, utensils and food containers language which I believe encourages the public to mix (contaminate) these items with their yardwaste and clean food scraps which today have an outlet and the others are frowned upon by the compost site operators. Given that this is a planning document, I believe a strong statement in the update regarding the need to amend the definition or the sector will be very slow to grow.

2.) 3.1 Municipal Contracts. I believe the Village of Addison contract is with Republic or now Groot and not Waste Management.

3.) 3.2 Multi-Family Recycling. Second paragraph starting with "Transportation is also," this sentence does not make sense? Next you talk about contamination, with the implementation of automated cart collection, contamination rates have increased. Route efficiency has occurred on the collection side while the processing side is seeing more contamination due to the larger cart and convenience. The recently enacted import ban on commodities to China are also straining the commodity side of the business. Sustainability will be reliant on the development of alternative other markets for the commodities.

3.) 3.7 Landscape Waste and Food Scraps. There is a discussion on the study that says there is a low demand for compost stalling the industry development. There is no differentiation between organic and food scrap amended compost. I believe the market reference is for organic compost only. I think a conversation on education needs to be in the narrative as well as the market concerns. Without education we will end just like the electronics business with very limited.

Last paragraph, I would like to suggest that you address my Dupage site as Midwest Compost, LLC, Dupage Yardwaste Location and add my Elgin location which borders Dupage and currently accepts yardwaste and food scraps from the County. This location is Midwest Compost, LLC, Cloverleaf Farms location.

4.) Maps. As far as the map goes, I am not sure what the reference is here? I think the public should see that there are no active landfills not only in Dupage county, but as well the 3-5 County area. Thus, showing the transfer stations, (including landscape waste) as well recycling facilities which gives a perspective to the public as to how the market has transitioned from a direct haul market to a long haul one for most all streams. This enters the element for the public to understand the potential costs of doing business are going up.

As you know I would love to discuss with you if you have time.
